**House Bill 0001
Introduced by: Rannyn Stevens**

A BILL

For An Act to Reform the Prison Industrial Complex in Wyoming

BE IT ENACTED by the Legislature of the 2015 Wyoming Boys State:

Section 1: The prison industrial complex will be reformed to follow imprisonment policies such as that of Switzerland, by drastically cutting the penalization of convicts committing nonviolent crimes.

Section 2: A nonviolent crime is defined as any crime that does not directly harm a living creature.

Imprisonment policies are defined as the legislations and laws by which we incarcerate criminals, and or laws pertaining to the conditions and length of imprisonment.

Section 3: The Federal bureau of prisons will oversee the transition of prisons toward a system, which functions similarly to that of Switzerland. The Legislative branch as a whole will oversee the incarceration times for nonviolent crimes reduced.

Section 4: This bill will be implemented upon the New Year, 1/1/2016.

Section 5: All other laws that are in conflict with this new policy shall hereby be declared null and void.

A BILL

For An Act to Provide College Credit to Eagle Scout Graduates

BE IT ENACTED by the Legislature of the 2015 Wyoming Boys State:

- Section 1: College credit will be provided for Eagle Scouts in the state of Wyoming.
- a. Credit hours will be provided, free of cost, in the state of Wyoming, by the University of Wyoming for scouts who successfully complete the Eagle rank through the Boy Scouts of America.
 - b. Successful Eagle Scouts will receive three (3) credit hours toward their college education.
- Section 2: College credit for scouts will only be offered to those who complete their eagle requirements.
- a. Those who fulfill the requirements explained in the current Boy Scout Handbook will be eligible for three cost-free credit hours.
 - b. In order to be eligible for three (3) cost-free credit hours, an Eagle Project that benefits the community must have been completed before the subject's eighteenth (18) birthday.

A BILL

For An Act to Allow the 3D Printing of Guns

BE IT ENACTED by the Legislature of the 2015 Wyoming Boys State:

Section 1: A person 18 or older can print 3D Guns

All guns must pass the legal requirements for a normal gun

All guns must meet guidelines for safety and/or be printed from blueprints that have passed the guidelines already

All guns must be embedded with a permanent metal pieces that cannot be removed without destroying the gun

Section 2: The person printing and using the gun must first pass a background check and failure to do so will deny them the rights to printing guns

A monitoring system must be physically put in place on the 3D printer to monitor what is being printed

A limit on guns that are 3D printed and the guns must be registered is enacted, this includes a permanent serial number embedded in the gun and the proper inspection of the gun

Failure to follow any of these guidelines will result in the removal of the person's 3D printer and anywhere from a large fine to prison for ten years

A BILL

For An Act to Change Speed Limits on State Highways

BE IT ENACTED by the Legislature of the 2015 Wyoming Boys State:

Section 1. Definitions.

- a) State highways are established, maintained and regulated by the state.
- b) All two lane highways may be raised to 75 miles per hour if certain conditions are met.

Section 2:

- a) Speeds may be raised on roads that;
 - (i) State highways that are four lanes or
 - (ii) Have wide shoulders or
 - (iii) Is engineered for travel at higher speeds
 - (iv) If traffic flow allows safe travel
 - (v) Speed limits may be determine by rules of the highway department

Section 3:

- a) Fines for violation of speeding on the faster speed will go off of or be based on the formula for the fines already present for 65 mile per hour highways.

Section 4:

- a) This shall go into effect ninety (90) days from its date of passage

A BILL

For An Act to Ban Assisted Suicide

BE IT ENACTED by the Legislature of the 2015 Wyoming Boys State:

- Section 1: AN ACT stating anyone who knowingly assists a person in suicide, or attempted suicide, is committing a crime.
- Section 2: Assisted suicide is, any person who knowingly, and willingly, assists in the death of another person.
- (a) Any person who provides the means of enabling suicide would be committing the crime of Assisted Suicide.
 - (b) Any person who facilitates or is in charge of the facilitation of a suicide would be charged with Assisted Suicide.
 - (c) Any person who has knowledge of the enabling or facilitation of the Assisted Suicide and fails to report it could be charged as an accessory to the crime.
- Section 3: Assisted Suicide is a felony. A felony punishable by up to 25 years in a Wyoming State penitentiary and a \$25,000 fine.
- Section 4: No funding is needed.

For An Act to Raise the State Minimum Wage

BE IT ENACTED by the Legislature of the 2015 Wyoming Boys State:

- Section 1: Every employer in the State of Wyoming shall pay to his or her employees no less than \$10.00 per hour.
- a. Employees under the age of eighteen are to be paid no less than \$8.00 per hour.
 - b. Employees eligible for the minimum wage must work greater than or equal to 15 hours a week per employer.
- Section 2: Every employer who employs tipped employees shall pay no less than \$7.00 per hour.
- a. If the wage for tipped employees is less than the value listed in Section 1, then it is the responsibility of the employer to pay the difference to the said employee.
 - b. A "tipped employee" is defined as any employee who regularly makes more than \$35.00 a month in tips from customers.
 - c. Employers of tipped employees are hereby required to record the amount of tips received for each employee monthly on behalf of the Internal Revenue Service (IRS).
- Section 3: The enforcement will be overseen by the Department of Workforce Services. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

For

An Act to Require Mandatory Labeling of Consumer Products that Contain Genetically Modified Organisms (GMO)

BE IT ENACTED by the Legislature of the 2015 Wyoming Boys State:

Section 1: Definitions

- (a) Mandatory Labeling is the requirement of consumer products to state their ingredients or components. A consumer product is any article, or component part thereof, produced or distributed for sale to a consumer for use in or around a permanent or temporary household, residence, a school, in recreation, or for personal use.
- (b) A GMO is a genetically modified organism, which is an organism whose genetic material has been altered by means of genetic engineering.

Section 2: Any product manufactured in Wyoming will have the standard label if it is a GMO product for the common good of the consumer.

Section 3: In order to obtain a license from the Wyoming Department of Agriculture to sell or serve to the general public, they will be required to label all GMO substances.

Section 4: If the Wyoming-based product supplier does not comply with the new GMO labeling standards then the Wyoming Department of Agriculture will fine the product supplier 30% of the supplier's yearly gross income and their license shall be revoked.

Section 5: All GMO products shall read This product contains GMOs. If the product contains trace amounts or if a crop is contaminated meaning has been pollinated with a GMO crop then the product must comply.

Section 6: This shall go into effect 180 days from its date of passage.

AN ACT TO ORGANIZE A MILITIA IN THE EVENT OF A ZOMBIE APOCALYPSE

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE 2015 BOYS STATE

SECTION 1. ALL PHYSICALLY ABLE CITEZANS OF THE STATE OF WYOMING MUST SUBMIT THEIR NAMES TO A DRAFT TO BE RANDOMLY SELECTED IN THE EVENT OF A ZOMBIE EMERGENCY.

- A. CITEZANS BETWEEN THE AGES OF 18 AND 40 ARE REQUIRED TO SUBMIT TO THE DRAFT.
- B. CITEZANS MAY ALSO VOLUNTEER FOR POSITIONS IN THE MILITIA.
- C. PHYSICAL FITNESS WILL DETERMINE ACCEPTANCE OF VOLUNTEERS.

SECTION 2. ALL CITEZANS IN THE MILITIA WILL PARTICIPATE IN FIREARM AND MARTIAL ARTS TRAINING.

- A. TRAINING AND AMMUNITION SUPPLIES WILL BE FUNDED BY THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT.
- B. TRAINING WILL CONSIST OF A RIGOROUS 11-HOUR DAILY ROUTINE OF CARDIOVASCULAR, MUSCULAR AND MENTAL EXERCISE.

SECTION 3. ALL MEMBERS OF THE MILITA MUST SWEAR AN OATH TO KILL ALL ZOMBIES REGARDLESS OF RELATIONS TO INFECTEES.

For

An Act for Wyoming Residents to Purchase Lifetime Hunting and Fishing Licenses

BE IT ENACTED by the Legislature of the 2015 Wyoming Boys State:

- Section 1: Anyone who has resided in Wyoming for 20 consecutive years, even if they are currently a resident of another state, may purchase a lifetime hunting/fishing license that allows said person to receive the same hunting/fishing privileges as a Wyoming resident.
- Section 2: The cost of a lifetime hunting/fishing license for current Wyoming residents, who satisfy the requirement of section 1, shall be \$500. The cost of a lifetime hunting/fishing license for previous Wyoming residents, who satisfy the requirements of section 1, shall be \$1000.
- Section 3: A holder of a lifetime hunting/fishing license shall not be exempt from the annual resident hunting/fishing license fees that are established by the Wyoming Game and Fish Commission.
- Section 4: A holder of a lifetime hunting/fishing license, who has been convicted of a felony shall immediately forfeit said license.

BE IT ENACTED by the Legislature of the 2015 Wyoming Boys State:

Section 1: The time change in the State of Wyoming shall occur the Saturday morning at 2 am instead of Saturday.

a The time will shift Friday night instead of Saturday night

Section 2: The rationale of this change will be to allow an extra day to adjust before the work week begins.

Section 3: No funding is required for this bill.

Section 1:

Section 2:

- B.) Some of the energies that could be used are as follows; hydropower, biofuels, solar power, wind energy.

Section 3:

- A.) The same percentage of money shall be taken out of the coal industry for the following 25 years.

BE IT ENACTED by the Legislature of the 2015 Wyoming Boys State:

- Section 1:** Due to rise in global population in addition to the rising generation of uneducated human beings adults planning to conserve should be required to take part in an IQ test with score determining the okay of child bearing and the recommended number of children.
- Section 2:** Accepting this bill would discourage uneducated people from becoming parents.
- Section 3:** Furthermore, a general IQ test would have multiple uses including, but not limited to, job placement, availability of resources and predicted intelligence of children.
- Section 4:** This shall take effect 6 months from being passed in order for the administration of tests to be successful.

For **An Act to Dismiss Students Who Do Not Wish to Learn**

BE IT ENACTED by the Legislature of the 2015 Wyoming Boys State:

Section 1: A mandatory test will cover the four core subjects will be taken by all students at the end of the every year in high school

- i. The four core subjects will be defined as math, science, language, and reading.

Section 2: Requirements

- i. A passing grade will be considered no less than a 75% average of all core subjects.
- ii. Any student that fails to meet the requirement will be ineligible for the following years. All students may have one opportunity to retake the test only once throughout high school, and must be taken during the summer.

Section 3: This shall be enforced unto every public and private school in the United States of America. No school shall be exempt.

Section 4: Punishments

- i. Any means of untruthfulness or failing to see that students are permanently dismissed from school will result in persecution and dismissal of the administrator responsible for enforcing said act.
 - a. All administrators who are persecuted are punishable by dismissal, revocation of administrator license, and a fine of up to \$10,000.

An Act to Mandate Every Household Own a Rooster

BE IT ENACTED by the Legislature of the 2015 Wyoming Boys State:

Section 1: Every House hold in Wyoming has to own at least one rooster.

- a. The rooster must be one year old and must be replaced if death occurs.
- b. They must treat the rooster with love and respect.
- c. This is to make sure everyone wakes up in the mornings

Section 2: Mistreatment of their rooster will lead to 3 years in a state jail.

Section 3: Household owners who work night shifts must still own a rooster but can have it in a special sound proof room.

For An Act to Legalize and Regulate Prostitution

BE IT ENACTED by the Legislature of the 2015 Wyoming Boys State:

- Section 1: All individuals over the age of 21 shall have the legal right to participate in sexual acts, subject to the approval of the Wyoming Department of Health, in exchange for any other non-illicit good and/or service.
- Section 2: The Wyoming Department of Health shall be tasked with assembling a board of seven members to regulate after the passage of this bill. Their regulations shall hold the same validity as this act. This council will be headed by the Director of the Wyoming Department of Health, with the remainder appointed by the Governor.
- Section 3: The act of prostitution shall be considered legal in any area in the State of Wyoming, after being granted a license, unless otherwise noted in this act
- A. Offering, attempting to offer, requesting, or committing any acts of prostitution within one-thousand feet of any school or daycare shall be punishable by law, and those convicted shall be required to pay a fine of \$500 and register as a sex-offender
 - B. Individuals previously convicted of abusing an illicit substance will not be granted a license to lawfully engage in prostitution in any location
- Section 4: A registry of all individuals granted the right to lawfully participate in prostitution shall be created and updated weekly, and a license to identify These individuals shall be issued by the Wyoming Department of Health
- B. Any individual who is granted a license shall be subject to renewal once a year, and a full physical and written approval of a licensed physician shall be required. An individual shall be required to be free of any transmittable diseases or illnesses.

An Act to Make Election Day a State Holiday

BE IT ENACTED by the Legislature of the 2015 Wyoming Boys State:

Section 1: Definitions

- a. Except as otherwise provided in this act
 - i. A state holiday is a day on which all state employees are exempt from work.
 - ii. Election Day is the Tuesday after the first Monday in November every even numbered year.

Section 2: Election Day is a legal holiday in and for the state of Wyoming.

- a. Reasons and Justifications
 - i. To allow for every citizen to have a state sponsored day that he or she may devote entirely to the planning and informing of his or her vote.
 - ii. To allow for every citizen to have a full and fair opportunity to cast his or her individual and informed vote on Election Day.

Section 3: All state entities will close on this day except for emergency and voting services.

An Act to Remove Parental Rights for Conviction of Rape

BE IT ENACTED by the Legislature of the 2015 Wyoming Boys State:

Section 1: Current codified law shall be amended to state that if a child is the product of an adjudicated rape the father loses all parental rights to the child.

Rape has to be proven by a court as a criminal matter. If convicted, parental rights to the child are immediately terminated.

Section 2: Rapist must provide child support for the first 18 years of the child's life.

Unless the convicted rapist is serving a prison sentence then payments will be made once convict is out of prison.

Section 3: Convicted rapist is not allowed any contact with the child, physically or otherwise.

An Act to Raise Taxes by Elimination of the Penny

BE IT ENACTED by the Legislature of the 2013 Wyoming Boys State:

SECTION 1: A new sales tax will introduce a gateway to the elimination of the U.S penny.

- a. After the checkout and application of traditional sales tax has occurred in a purchase, any cent amount not divisible evenly by five (i.e. \$2.43 or \$11.37 etc.) will be rounded up to the next increment of five cents. This amount of money will be collected with the traditional state sales tax.
- b. This sales tax will affect all commercial purchases excluding those of food stuffs or beverages, and medications, over the counter or prescribed. Alcoholic beverages will not be exempt from this sales tax.
- c. This tax will provide data for the legitimacy and possible success of the penny to be taken out of U.S. currency, and does not actually eliminate the penny or the use of the penny.

Section 2

- a. These funds collected from the newly proposed Five Cent Tax will go to the Board of Education for the state. The Board will hire additional language instructors by the same protocols as it currently hires any foreign language teachers.

BE IT ENACTED by the Legislature of the 2015 Wyoming Boys State:

Preamble:

Bison have been around since the Ice Age.
Bison can survive in most habitats found in the United States.
Bison have fed our ancestors since they first came to the New World.
Bison have been a large part of America's economy.
Bison have been the greatest environmental success story in the entire world.
Native Americans used to revere them.
Bison is a quickly growing demand in most food markets.
Bison were more numerous than most other large game animals in North America.
There is the silhouette of a bison featured on the Wyoming state flag.

Section 1: The species Bison Bison Bison shall be recognized as the National Mammal of the United States of America and the State of Wyoming

Section 2: National Bison Day will be a celebrated holiday in the State of Wyoming.

National Bison Day is November 1st.

Section 3: Celebration will commence with any and all of the following:

The eating of Bison- including steaks, tongues, jerky, sausage

The wearing of Bison costumes, including anything wooly, hairy and brown, no matter how awkward looking, will be encouraged to be worn in public as long as conforming to all public decency laws.

Bison games, including "Pin the Tail on the Bison" and "8-Second Ride" on a Bison will be allowed if the participant signs self-liability coverage

For An Act to Lower the Drinking Age

BE IT ENACTED by the Legislature of the 2015 Wyoming Boys State:

Section 1: The age required to purchase alcoholic liquor shall be lowered to 18.

- a. Alcoholic liquor shall be defined as spirituous or fermented fluid, substance or compound other than malt beverage intended for beverage purposes which contains at least one-half of one percent (.5%) of alcohol by volume.
- b. All licensees shall be permitted to sell and distribute alcoholic liquor to persons aged 18 or greater. Licensee shall be defined as anyone holding a retail liquor license, limited retail liquor license, resort liquor license, county retail malt beverage permit, malt beverage permit, restaurant liquor license, catering permit, or bar and grill liquor license.

Section 2: All persons of or over the age of 18 shall be allowed to possess and consume alcoholic liquor.

- a. Persons aged of or over the age of 18 shall be granted the right to possess alcoholic liquor in a closed container in public.
- b. Persons aged of or over the age of 18 shall be granted the right to possess and consume alcoholic liquor in an open container in a private setting.

Section 3: Any persons subjected to restrictions concerning the possession of alcoholic liquor, shall remain restricted. Any persons including, but not limited to, criminals and the mentally ill shall be subject to and shall remain under restrictions on possession and consumption of alcoholic liquor.

Section 4: This bill shall be put into effect 30 days after passage.

An Act to Require Military Service to Complete High School during War-Time

BE IT ENACTED by the Legislature of the 2015 Wyoming Boys State:

Section 1: After meeting regular High School graduation requirements, two years of military service are required during war-time in order to obtain a high school diploma. One year is required in an active role, partaking in Basic Training and meeting the goals set forth by the military.

Waivers for physical impairment shall be provided on a needed basis with the expectation of continuing to meet service requirements and basic training obligations

Section 2: Failure to meet the graduation requirements during designated War-time will prevent individuals from graduating High School. Individuals failing to meet this requirement shall not be eligible for state employment of any kind including county government, city government or school district employment

An Act for Voter Accountability

BE IT ENACTED by the Legislature of the 2015 Wyoming Boys State:

- Section 1:** All citizens shall be required to provide proof of payment of personal income taxes in order exercise the right to vote in any public election.
- a. Proof of payment shall be defined as copy of an IRS form 1040, 1040a or 1040EZ.
 - b. Public elections include federal presidential, legislative, state gubernatorial, legislative and local (town, county or district) elections.
- Section 2:** A state panel shall be established by the governor to administer this program.
- a. The governor shall appoint five individuals to this panel.
 - b. Appointees shall be confirmed by the full Senate.
 - c. The panel shall determine protocols for voting site verification of tax records.
- Section 3:** The Legislature shall appropriate from the General Fund sufficient budget to administer the program and protocols determined by the State Panel.

An Act to Place the Wyoming High School Activities Association Under the Control of the Wyoming Department of Education

BE IT ENACTED by the Legislature of the 2015 Wyoming Boys State:

Section 1: Definitions

Activities shall be defined as any and all extracurricular activities any Wyoming High School offers for its students.

Section 2:

The Superintendent of Education for the State of Wyoming shall appoint a Director to direct the department every four years as a new Superintendent takes office.

The Director of the Wyoming High School Activities Department shall oversee the department's actions. The director also shall propose regulations for all Wyoming high school students participating in activities to the superintendent for approval.

Section 3:

The Wyoming High School Activities Department shall set state-wide regulations that must be agreed to by any students wishing to participate in an activity.

- a. Regulations shall include but are not limited to minimum grade point averages maintained by participating students, drug, alcohol, and tobacco usage by participating students, and medical/health examinations for students participating in a physical sport activity.
- b. Agreement from students to regulations must consist of a signed official form in which is filed with the Wyoming High School Activities Department office.

An Act to Create and Maintain a State Defense Force

BE IT ENACTED by the Legislature of the 2015 Wyoming Boys State:

Section 1. Wyoming will officially have a State Defense Force which will actively replace the National Guard for state-wide emergencies.

- a. Training will focus on discipline, weapons training, and mental tempering.
- b. One barracks will exist in each of Wyoming's counties

Section 2: All individuals who have not graduated nor received a GED will be required to join the Wyoming State Defense Force for a minimum of 7 months.

Juvenile delinquents will additionally have the option of serving a time, set by the judge, in the State Defense Force in lieu of a jail sentence or a Juvenile Detention Center.

Section 3: Any resident of the state of Wyoming may volunteer for service in the State Defense Force

- a. The State Defense force will have a pay grade similar to the military pay grade.
- b. Criminals who have committed misdemeanors may receive the option of serving a time, set by the judge, spent in the State Defense Force in lieu of a jail sentence or probation.

An Act to Limit Death Row Appeals

BE IT ENACTED by the Legislature of the 2015 Wyoming Boys State:

Section 1: Definitions

- i. Appeal shall be defined as a legal proceeding by which the case is brought before a higher court for review of the decision of a lower court.
- ii. Exonerating evidence shall be defined as any evidence that a court shall deem beneficial to the appellant.
- iii. A conviction shall be defined as anyone found guilty of criminal charges by in a criminal court of law.
- iv. Convict shall be defined as any person that has been convicted of or plead guilty to criminal charges and is sentenced to death.

Section 2: After a conviction, a convict shall only be allowed one appeal in which the convict shall have to raise all arguments for having the sentence overturned and the appeal's maximum length of time shall be 5 years from the date of sentencing.

Section 3: This one appeal is also the only appeal in which the convict shall appeal with state-paid attorneys.

Section 4: Only when the judge decides there is possible exonerating evidence shall the convict be allowed an additional appeal after the first.

A Resolution Calling for the Abolishment of the United State Postal Service

BE IT ENACTED by the Legislature of the 2015 Wyoming Boys State:

Section 1. All offices of the United States Postal Service shall cease function

Section 2. All faculties and property of the United States Postal service shall be auctioned to private mail-oriented corporations.

- a. A mail-oriented corporation shall be defined as a business whose main operation consists of the transportation and delivery of letters and parcels.
- b. All businesses who wish to purchase facilities owned by the United States Postal Service must apply to the United States Postal Regulatory Commission for a license to participate in the auction.
- c. The auction date shall be set forth by the United State Postal Regulatory Commission.
- d. All businesses must apply for an auction license within ninety (90) days of this bill's passage.

Section 3. United States Postal Service shall submit an inventory to the United States Postal Regulatory Commission within ninety (90) days from the date of this bill's passage.

An Act to Improve Railway Infrastructure

BE IT ENACTED by the Legislature of the 2015 Wyoming Boys State:

- Section 1:** A committee shall be established consisting of seven Wyoming citizens prominent in the field of Rail Infrastructure or other similar fields in order to create, maintain, and operate a rail infrastructure owned by the State of Wyoming.
- a. Positions on this committee will be appointed by the Governor of the State of Wyoming every two years.
 - b. The committee shall assemble a written report of the state of the infrastructure to be sent to the Governor monthly, and have a physical meeting with the Governor quarterly.
- Section 2.** This rail infrastructure will serve its primary purpose by being leased to various private industries and organizations approved by the aforementioned committee for a price also agreed upon by the committee.
- a: All funds will first go to maintaining and improving the rail infrastructure.
 - b: All surplus funds will go directly into the State of Wyoming Treasury.
- Section 3:** This committee will be appointed by the Governor every two years.

An Act to Institute the Federal DREAM Act

BE IT ENACTED by the Legislature of the 2015 Wyoming Boys State:

- Section 1.** All illegal aliens residing in the State of Wyoming that meet the basic requirements of the DREAM Act shall be granted United States citizenship.
- a. The main criteria of the DREAM Act are:
 - i. You entered the country before the age of 16;
 - ii. You graduate high school or obtain a GED;
 - iii. You have good moral character; and
 - iv. You have at least five years of continuous presence in the United States of America.
- Section 2.** All illegal aliens that qualify for citizenship through the DREAM Act must prove their standing in the United States of America during a six-year tenure following approval for naturalization.
- a. Aliens must obtain a two-year college degree or complete two years of military service during the six-years allotted.
 - b. One of the two post-approval requirements must be met in order for the naturalization process to begin.

An Act to Allow Private Ownership of Big Game Animals

BE IT ENACTED by the Legislature of the 2015 Wyoming Boys State:

- Section 1.** Private individuals shall have the right to own big game animals.
- Big game animals shall be defined as elk, deer, moose, bighorn sheep, mountain goat, bison, pronghorn antelope.
- Private owners of big game animals shall have the right to allow harvest of said animals only during established big game season as enacted by the Wyoming Game and Fish.
- Section 2.** Private owners will be responsible for providing the state veterinary office with complete vaccine records of all animals being brought into the state within 14 days of receiving the papers.

Legalizing Marijuana for Medicinal Usage

BE IT ENACTED by the Legislature of the 2015 Wyoming Boys State:

- Section 1.** Marijuana will be legalized in the medical field to be used to treat those who need it and only for that use. Marijuana will be placed in the hospitals for the patients. Doctors will be the only ones to prescribe it.
- Section 2.** If Marijuana is used outside of medical field advancements then the users will be prosecuted and placed in jail for a court determined time. After they get out of jail, the person will be placed on house arrest for a period of time with an arrest bracelet.
- Section 3.** This law shall be enforced by local law enforcement and the Wyoming Medical community.
- Section 4.** This bill will go into effect January, 2009 and will be publicly announced outside of hospitals and to patients.

An Act Recognizing Strawberry-Rhubarb as the Official Wyoming State Pie

BE IT ENACTED by the Legislature of the 2015 Wyoming Boys State:

Section 1: Definitions.

Pie will be defined as a baked dish made with fruit, meat, etc., and having either an under crust, an upper crust, or both.

Section 2: The state of Wyoming will recognize strawberry-rhubarb pie as the official state pie.

Section 3: The recipe for a standard 9" state pie.

- a. $\frac{1}{2}$ c. sugar, 3 tbsp. cornstarch, $\frac{1}{4}$ tsp. salt, $\frac{1}{4}$ tsp. ground nutmeg, 3 c. rhubarb, 2 c. strawberries, 1 tbsp. butter.
- b. There are no specifics as to the crust ingredients.
- c. The state pie's ingredients may be substituted, altered and may vary in amount.
- d. The state pie must contain strawberry and rhubarb.

Section 4: The state of Wyoming holds no legal bindings to the state pie or strawberry rhubarb pie.
