




Commemorating The Boys State Class of 1816

In honor of the 200th Anniversary of the Boys State Class of 1816, we would like to give a special profile for Captain Rusty Ridley (1816), the current Wyoming Boys' State chairman. His service to WWBS has been truly noteworthy, considering his cataracts make reading near impossible.

Born in 1799, Captain Ridley attended Boys' State in 1816, as a member of the Pioneer Party. Like future nominee Ryley Constable, he was defeated by the Frontier Party nominee, this time a fellow named Henry Clay.

After nearly 100 years, Captain Ridley was appointed chairman of Wyoming Boys' State in 1907 by President Theodore Roosevelt. Please thank and congratulate him for his service, and remind him to take his blood thinner and to take his dentures out before he goes to sleep.

An Act to Derecognize Canada as an Official Nation

Be it Enacted by the Legislature of the 2016 Wyoming Boys State:

Section 1.

(a) The State of Wyoming will remove diplomatic recognition from the country of Canada, thus removing all treaties and agreements formerly held between the State of Wyoming and the Nation of Canada.

Section 2.

- (a) Currently (as of 5/17/2016) Canada is seen and treated as an official nation and sovereign state with individual and legitimate power and influence over Wyoming law and engagements. From this point on, the Nation of Canada will be no longer be seen in the eyes of the governing body as legitimate or official.
- (b) All citizens of the State of Wyoming will adhere to this law and ignore the nation of Canada and its legitimacy in total.

Section 3.

- (a) This Act will be seen as a misdemeanor with fines imposed on those who infringe on this Act.
- (b) First time offenders will pay a fine of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) with subsequent infractions increasing in five hundred dollar (\$500) increments.
- (c) In the case of five (5) infractions of this Act, criminals are subject to up to three (3) years in prison.

Section 4.

(a) Act will be effective immediately (5/17/2016).
